



Good of the Order

The VFW legislative agenda for the Department of Minnesota has a number of key elements including the following:

- ★ Department of Military Affairs and the Department of Veterans Affairs omnibus budget bill
- ★ Property tax exemption for property owned by a Veterans Service organization
- ★ An increase in veterans with a disability homestead exclusion provision
- ★ Veterans Service organizations to use gross profits from lawful gambling for repair, maintenance or improvement of real property
- ★ Veterans and surviving spouses taxable Social Security benefits full subtraction provision
- ★ Veterans exempted from motor vehicle registration taxes and fees including license plates, title, and driver's license and identification card fees and motor vehicle sales taxes
- ★ Federal accreditation requirement for benefit service providers

VFW Post 494 Golf League 2024

Greetings VFW golfers! We are nearing the start date of our golf league which begins on Apr. 16, weather permitting. We have some exciting changes to the league this year which I am hoping will provide more interest and fun, and maybe even a little trash-talking and bragging rights!

Highlights of the season:

We play Tuesdays at Eagle Lake Golf Course, Plymouth, with five tee times starting at 10:36. Steve Jones **314-537-3088** is league captain.

Costs:

No League fees! Best value is probably to purchase the "Tour Card" for \$30 which will then allow you seniors to pay \$15 for 9 holes. Senior carts are \$8 per rider, not selling punch cards this year but will honor them if you have one left from last year.

The season pass is \$449 and is for unlimited golf at several Three Rivers courses. Season runs Apr. 16 thru Oct. 29, weather permitting.

Four Fun tournaments are back on 4th Tuesdays beginning in May.

We will be tracking scores and awarding league standing points based on Net handicapped scores.

This is a feature of the Golf League Tracker application we use. We will divide the season into 3 segments of 6 Tuesdays each. Points will be awarded for the four best NET scores each week, plus 1 point for showing up and playing. As the six week season progresses, you will be able to see the 'standings' against the other league players.



This a NET score system, meaning that the program calculates your handicap and uses that to 'place' all the players.

This means players of ALL abilities can score well and finish in the top four each week.

We also have the capability to track "Skins" games each week.

This is voluntary – no one has to participate.

Each week, players can put in \$5 to one or both of two games: gross skins or net skins.

Steve Jones, League Captain, will take the money and use the program to determine the winners. Money will be awarded next week.

A player wins a 'skin' by having the lowest gross or lowest net score on a hole. The total collected is divided by the number of skins won.

So if 4 guys put in \$5, \$20 total, and two skins are won, each of those skins is worth \$10.

All this is to help make the league more fun and to increase participation.

This year, we also want to encourage players to **go to the post after the golf rounds** for a beverage and or a meal. We want to support our post. Plus, I will be entering scores, and should be able to quickly update the league standings. It will be fun!
