

There were six comrades from your own Crystal VFW Post 494, along with seven or eight comrades from Palmer Lake Post 3915, and Elk River-Rogers Post 5518, who



shared a bus with us arranged by Past Commander Fred Crimmins. No parking hassles and no snow to deal with this year. That hasn't been true in years past.

We had important work to do, raising our voices in support of the Omnibus Bill consolidating veterans' issues in one piece of legislation, so it would not be

Let us, then, at the time appointed, gather around their sacred remains and garland the passionless mounds above them with choicest flowers of springtime; let us raise above them the dear old flag they saved from dishonor; let us in this solemn presence renew our pledges to aid and assist those whom they have left among us as sacred charges upon the nation's gratitude—the soldier's and sailor's widow and orphan ... " (May 1868, Gen. John Logan)

All young men with me in the Texas A&M Univ. Corps of Cadets. And like me, they went on to serve as officers in the armed forces of this great nation. Proud to do so, and never wavering from the chance of the "ultimate sacrifice." Yet, they were called to that sacrifice as each was lost while on active duty. I remember . . .

Kenny... that name always brings a lump to my throat and a tear to my eye. Kenny was in high school with my

oldest son. Kenny enlisted in the USMC and served in Afghanistan where he was killed in combat. His parents received the notification on Mother's Day, which we also observe this month. I remember . . .

You have your own names of comrades lost in war or lost to time, disease, or accident. Perhaps you sometimes wonder why you went home and they did not. You remember . . .

"Until the sea shall give up her dead . . . " is a phrase from the traditional burial ceremony for sailors and marines. And it points to reality that even death is not the final state. "I am the resurrection and the Life," says Jesus pointing us to a grand reunion with which every other reunion pales in comparison. We have the promise that when He returns, war and death shall be no more! I remember . . .

But until that Day, we remember . . .
